# ADMINISTRATION

# Office:

- Danielle Schmidt worked full-time in the position of Program Coordinator 40
  hours/week
- Alexandra Karatairis worked 163 hours and then Geneva Coulter took over as the new summer student for 222 hours over the summer as our Fundraising Event Coordinator 30 hours/week to organize and run the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Hope Classic

#### Membership:

- We have 285 members on our Membership List
- 85 members renewed their membership during the last fiscal year
- The SBHANA is only sending email communications to members who have subscribed and gave consent to continue receiving these e-communications

#### Strategic Plan:

- The Board re-evaluated what we want to accomplish in the next five years back on February 8, 2017 & set some new goals for which action plans were created
- The Board continues to follow the Strategic Plan that was developed in February 2017

## Fund Development:

- The SBHANA Casino was held on April 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at Century Casino with Margaret Miller as the Casino Chairperson
- AGLC Casino money in the amount of \$74,267.37 was received in August 2018
- SBHANA's next Casino will be in the second quarter (April, May or June) of 2020
- Successful fundraisers & public awareness events held this year:
  - Hope Classic income **\$22,450.60** 20% of proceeds excluding corporate donations went to SBHAC (\$2,912.29 to SBHAC); **profit \$19,538.31**
  - Raffle (drawn at our Hope Classic event) income \$9,950.00
  - KMS Tools Smokie Sale \$1,400.00 (June) & \$1,380.00 (November)
  - Hope Classic Online Auction **\$203.00**
  - Christmas Party Silent Auction \$520.00

  - 5) Edmonton Public Teachers Local Charity Trust (\$3,500)







- Danielle Schmidt did a presentation on December 12th to the Edmonton Civic Employees Charitable Assistance Fund (ECECAF) Board about our organization and the benefits of our support fund. The purpose was to ask them for some funding support for this important program we offer.

# **COMMUNITY BUILDING**

- Advertised like-minded organizations, programs and services through our updates and opportunity emails and our newsletter
- Partnered with the Centre for Literacy to offer a 10-week Executive Functioning Workshop for six of our members aged 9 14
- Started a partnership with Kids Up Front Edmonton to help create opportunities and life-changing experiences for our members by providing event tickets to an art, cultural, sport or recreation events; distributed 128 tickets to members so far

# EDUCATION

#### SB/H Awareness:

- June Awareness Month 2018: High Level bridge was lit green on June 8th, Bridge banners were placed on three overpasses around the city, Awareness Displays for SB&H was set up and manned by volunteers at the following locations: KMS Tools for 3 days in June & again in November
- Wrote a letter to City of Edmonton Mayor, Don Iveson, in regard to, proclaiming June SB&H Awareness Month
- On June 4th, Alberta Minister of Health, Honourable Sarah Hoffman, invited a group of us to attend an official proclamation at the AB Legislature Building declaring that June is SB&H Awareness month in the province of Alberta
- Hope Classic Media: Geneva Coulter & Jaxon Giesbrecht did an on-television interview with CTV & Geneva Coulter did another interview at the Hope Classic









# MEMBER SUPPORT

#### Information Updates:

#### **Social Activities:**

- Summer BBQ held in conjunction with the Hope Classic on August 11, 2018 with over 150 people in attendance
- Christmas Party was held on December 1, 2018 with well over 100 members, family members, volunteers and staff who attended
- Chera Giesbrecht hosted the Mom's Tapas Supper on Friday, May 4, 2018 and there were 6 Moms in attendance who all had a great time getting together and catching up

#### Camp Freedom:

- 2018 Camp Freedom was our 18<sup>th</sup> annual year
- It was held on July 31<sup>st</sup> to August 3<sup>rd</sup>
- There were 25 campers who registered but 3 were unable to attend due to • unforeseen circumstances, so there were 22 campers in attendance from all around Western Canada
- 15 volunteers helped make the week of camp possible •



#### Support Fund:

- Approved 53 different support fund requests with a total value of \$27,356.03
- Budget remained at \$30,000/year, funding stayed at \$1,500 per member with spina bifida and/or hydrocephalus for the year
- Health & Wellness component of the support fund was taken out of our support fund criteria

### Member Education Fund:

The member education fund was not accessed in 2018 •

#### Scholarship:

There was one scholarship recipient this year: Gbemiro Adegbuyi was given the Dr. Peter Bowen Scholarship receiving \$1,000 towards his post-secondary education





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# Wheelchair Loaner Program:

- 2 Quickie Kids wheelchairs available for short-term loans
- Both are still loaned out over the course of the year; no new requests for the wheelchairs have been made

# **New Parent Bags:**

• 5 New Parent Bags were distributed through the Spina Bifida Clinic at the Glenrose & 3 more bags are made up for distribution when needed



- Coffee nights continued throughout the year on the first Thursday of each month
- NoLimits members helped volunteer with the Raffle, KMS Tools Smokie Sales, Hope Classic and Christmas Party

#### Adult Retreat
